This month MOIC proudly marks its 10th anniversary. Founded in 2015 by the Department of Health, MOIC has grown into a global leader in medicines optimisation, enhancing health outcomes, boosting efficiency, and reducing waste. Core-funded by the Department of Health and supported by grants and commercial income, MOIC has spent a decade transforming healthcare.



Over the past ten years, MOIC has prioritised patient needs, accelerated innovation, fostered collaboration, and strengthened Northern Ireland's economy.

Our groundbreaking research—including EU-funded projects like SHAPES, iSIMPATHY, and the new iMPROVE initiative exploring personalised medicine—has set new standards. Within Health and Social Care (HSC), we have embedded practical innovations like post-discharge pharmacist follow-ups and Pharmacy First services.

MOIC's success reflects its 25+ partnerships with academia, industry, and healthcare leaders across Ireland, Europe, and beyond. Collaborations with groups like the Polish Society of Clinical Pharmacy and the Commonwealth Pharmacists' Association have advanced clinical practice, while its response to Covid-19–supporting PPE procurement and drug modelling—highlighted its agility. With 65 publications and 121 presentations to date, MOIC's influence is global.

Beyond innovation, MOIC champions staff wellbeing, earning Take 5 workplace accreditation. Looking ahead, we are currently advancing iMPROVE, expanding digital health, and deepening its economic and policy impact. 
## MOIC to Attend NORDIC Social Pharmacy Conference 2025
