### Professor Mike Scott MBE Honoured with Special Recognition Award at Northern Ireland Healthcare Awards 2025

MOIC is thrilled to announce that their Director, Professor Mike Scott MBE, has been awarded a Special Recognition Award at the recent Northern Ireland Healthcare Awards. The ceremony, opened by Health Minister Mike Nesbitt, gathered senior healthcare professionals to celebrate outstanding contributions to the region's healthcare sector.

This year's awards were particularly significant for MOIC as they celebrated 10 years of pioneering work in medicines optimisation. The evening became even more memorable when Professor Mike Scott was announced as the recipient of the Special Recognition Award, receiving a standing ovation from attendees. The award was presented by Chief Pharmaceutical Officer, Cathy Harrison.

### Highlights from HEPS2025 Conference in Dublin



### MOIC Celebrates Success of Foyle Hospice Pathfinder Project

MOIC is pleased to announce the successful completion of the evaluation of a groundbreaking project at Foyle Hospice. The project implemented HS21 prescribing to improve palliative care

This initiative aimed to test new prescribing and supply models and enabled specialist palliative care doctors and nurses at Foyle Hospice to prescribe medications for patients at home. Local community pharmacies provided the necessary supplies.

MOIC led the evaluation of this project, with Rachel Huey presenting its key outcomes. The project has significantly cut patient waiting times for medications, reduced GP workload, and allowed more patients nearing the end of life to receive care at home. It has also strengthened partnerships among healthcare teams.

Following this success, a recommendation will be made to gradually adopt HS21 prescribing as standard practice in all hospice settings across Northern Ireland. MOIC is proud to contribute to this changing approach, which improves palliative care for patients and families.







#### Mikas Glatkauskas Visits MOIC

Mikas Glatkauskas, a PhD student from Norway, recently completed a placement with MOIC, contributing to his PhD studies at University of Oslo. During the learning visit he participated in various meetings and delivered presentations on his PhD research to MOIC, the Department of Health and clinical teams. Mikas learnt more about clinical activities, and appreciated spending time with pharmacists working in care homes, a rheumatology clinic acute assessment unit, discharge follow up and OPAT.

Reflecting on his visit, Mikas shared, "It was a fantastic experience to see how pharmacists work in Northern Ireland. It was truly inspiring to see the potential this profession can have and I am highly motivated to pursue the improvement of pharmacy practice in Norway as well. Thank you MOIC, your hospitality was brilliant."

Mikas' first paper: Application of a Human Factors Approach to Investigate the Hospital to Home Transition for Patients with Multiple Long-term Conditions," was also recently published and is now live on ScienceDirect and available to over 15 million researchers worldwide.
